Viking Coastal Trail

The 43.5km (27 miles) route forms part of Regional Route 15 of the National Cycle Network from Reculver in the north around the coast to Pegwell Bay in the south, and then linking inland as far as St Nicholas-at-Wade.

For the energetic, the complete route can be tackled in one go, but for families or those who prefer a more leisurely ride, the route can be picked up or finished at any point.

There are lots of things to see or do along the route and some really tempting places for refreshments. Cliftop pubs, seafront ice cream parlours, continental style cafes for alfresco dining, cockle and whelk stalls or traditional seaside fish and chips, the choice is yours.

There are also six themed mini-routes to be discovered, depending on your interest: The Six Churches – a very pretty rural route taking in one of the oldest religious buidings in England.

History, Art and Architecture – a little bit of everything from historical architecture to modern art on this Ramsgate-based ride.

Historic Broadstairs – discover what attracted and inspired great historical characters like Charles Dickens.

The Path of St. Augustine – St. Augustine landed near Ebbsfleet in 597 AD with the intention of bringing Christianity to England, retrace his steps.

Smugglers' Haunts – an opportunity to discover the darker side of our coastal heritage.

Beaches and Bays – a completely coastal ride taking in eight bays, many of which hold Quality Coast or Blue Flag Awards.

We share the same coastline with internationally important wildlife, so please help by following these simple voluntary codes to help local wildlife and show respect for other beach users. There's a general seashore code and ones for specific activities such as horse riding, dog walking, powercraft activities, wind-powered activities, shellfish harvesting and fixed netting, shore angling, bait digging and collecting, and field trips.

Respect our coastal wildlife – try to leave everything as you find it, or would like to find it

Consider our coastline and other users – take your rubbish home, report hazards; and respect the rights of other users. **Stay safe** – be careful on slippery rocks, of the in-coming tide, and follow bay safety signs

Be Environmentally friendly –

buy postcards or take photos of marine creatures, instead of taking marine curios.

The whole of our coastline is designated as part of the 'North East Kent European marine sites' covering a number of international nature conservations designations. For information about the Management Scheme see www.thanetcoast.org.uk

Our coastline represents 20% of the UK's and 12% of Europe's coastal chalk and we have the longest continuous stretch of chalk cliffs in Britain.



Café open in the evening, another great place to have a meal and drink whilst watching fantastic sunset views. Listed by The Independent as one of the country's top 20 beaches – rocking rockpools. Beach wheelchairs available.



St Mildreds Bay CT8 8TR



Sandy bay with promenade, cliffs and tidal pool. Tidal bay except on spring tides. Lovely little crabbing pool that will keep the children amused for ages. Tennis, putting and public house with restaurant nearby. Find the World War 1 seaplane lookout that is still in place here. In 1916 it proved too dangerous to continue landing planes here, so Manston airfield was developed.

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Awards shown have been applied for and are waiting confirmation.

Westbrook Bay

Sandy beach approx. 200 metres long with promenade. A great family beach, off the beaten track. Designated water ski area. Strokes Adventure Golf, bowls and tennis nearby. Café open all year, weekends only in winter. The former Seabathing Hospital overlooked Westbrook Bay. The fresh air and sea water was thought to be extremely beneficial to good health.

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Margate Main Sands

CT9 1XJ

CT9 5DL

Sandy and approx. 200 metres long with promenade and boardwalk. Tidal boating pool, donkey rides and children's rides. **Golden sands galore, perfect for family fun and bathing**. Shops and amusements nearby. Disabled toilets at nearby Buenos Ayres. Just a couple of minutes walk from Margate Station and the town centre, but once on the beach the hustle and bustle completely disappears and you're in another world. Beach wheelchairs available.

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Walpole Bay (Palm Bay/Hodges Gap and Foreness Point) CT9 2HL

Popular water sports area approx. 400 metres long with sandy beach, promenade and tidal swimming pool. Nearby Jet Ski World. Water ski area, golf, putting, tennis and indoor bowls nearby. Lots of activities at this great stretch of coastline. **Walpole Bay has one of the last Victorian tidal swimming pools to be built**.



Botany Bay

CTTO 310

Popular yet quiet sandy bay approx 200 metres long. Thanet's best-kept secret, a secluded bay with breathtaking chalk features. This bay got its name because the common fate of a captured smuggler was deportation to Botany Bay in Australia on a convict ship. In the late 18th century there was a big battle here between the smugglers and the revenue men, which resulted in quite a few fatalities.

Kingsgate Bay CT10 3QH



Quiet and secluded sandy beach approx. 150 metres long. A great bay for those who like to get away from it all and have a bit of space to themselves. It also has some of the best examples of sea caves in the country. This bay used to be called St. Bartholomew's Bay until King Charles I was landed here for safety during a squall and he ordered that the name be changed to Kingsaate Bay.

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Joss Bay

CT10 3PG



QUALITY

Popular sandy bay approx. 200 metres long. This bay is a must for keen surfers and those who wish to learn. Joss Bay Surf School. Surf boards and wetsuit hire, amusements. Joss Snelling, the notorious smuggler and head of the Callis Court Gang was named after this bay. He was fined £100 for smuggling at the age of 89!

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Stone Bay

CT10 1D



Peaceful sandy bay approx. 200 metres long with chalk cliffs, rock pools and promenade. Disabled access via Broadstairs harbour. A great little bay seldom discovered by visitors and good for rockpooling.



CT10 1QS



Viking Bay

Resort's main bay. Sandy beach approx. 150 metres long with cliff-top promenade, harbour pier and boardwalk. Surf School, surf ski/belly boards, shops, restaurants and amusements nearby. Louisa Bay

CT10 1PU

Quiet sandy bay approx. 150 metres long with promenade. Disabled access via quite steep slope. **Another great little bay for rockpooling and sand castle building.** Originally called Goodstone steps. Thomas Russell Crampton built a lattice-work bridge across the gap here and it was renamed Louisa Bay after one of his family members.



Dumpton Gap

CT10 1TA

Quiet, sandy bay approx. 150 metres long with some rocks and promenade. Disabled access via quite steep slope. This is one of the best low tide walking routes to Ramsgate and where natural profile of cliff to sea can be found. Check low tide times before walking.



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Ramsgate Main Sands

CT11 8|D

Popular sandy beach approx. 250 metres long with promenade. Donkey rides, boardwalk, designated jet ski area adjacent to main beach, shops and children's amusements nearby. A resort beach situated right next to the glorious Royal Harbour and Marina. Lots of little bars and cafés close at hand for leisurely lunches – a real continental feel. Beach wheelchairs available.

Pegwell Bay

CI I 2 5JE

A stretch of unprotected sea cliffs with great geological interest and a sandy bay used by large numbers of seashore birds. A perfect place to experience coastal wildlife. The bay is also part of Kent's largest National Nature Reserve. Viking Ship 'Hugin' stands proudly on the clifftop overlooking the bay. Pegwell Bay was a popular excursion destination for Victorian holidaymakers who used to ride from Ramsgate to the bay on donkey chaisse.

Making sure you are safe on our beaches is extremely important to us. Our bay inspectors and lifeguards are there to help and offer advice - please just ask. You can also help yourself by being aware of the following:

Barbecues

Individual barbeaues are permitted on all beaches and bays after 6pm. Organised group barbeques are allowed on Joss Bay by prior agreement with the Foreshore Department on 01843 577274.

Child safety animal signs

Most of our main bays have highly visible signposts, all resembling different animals instantly recognisable to children. These are here to help you locate your position on the beach and to help your little ones find their way back to you should they wander off.

Emergencies

If you see someone in trouble, go to the lifeguard or bay inspector for help. Do not try to rescue them yourself. Out of season you should telephone the coastguard on 999.

Ensure you don't burn

- Always cover up.
- Stay in the shade between 11am and 3pm.
- Use factor 15+ sunscreen and apply regularly.
- Remember to take extra care with children
- Don't be fooled by a sea breeze. you may be cool but you will still burn.

Inflatables

Beware of using these even in a gentle breeze, they can easily be blown out to sea. If possible tie them to the shore, and if your children are using them - never let them out of your sight.

Know your flags

Red and yellow flag lifeguard-patrolled bathing area. Always swim between the flags and within the bouys on all beaches.
